The Spartans have gone down to defeat thrice by scores of 19-6 to Santa Monica, 26-0 to Hawthorne and 33-21 to Redondo.

The Bay League decider may have come about Friday when Palos Verdes kept its unblemished record intact, 26-20, against Santa Monica.
