

### Penetron Given to El Camino

Presentation of a Penetron device for measuring thickness and density of materials by means of gamma rays from a radioactive source, to El Camino College has been announced. The Torrance Refinery of Mobil Oil Co. donated the instrument which was used at the refinery to measure pipe and pressure vessel wall thickness to determine wear and erosion.

The Penetron will be used in a nuclear science survey course, according to Warren Ford and John Moehlman of the El Camino Engineering Department.

Other uses will include demonstrating radio isotope applications in engineering courses and nondestructive test portion of the metallurgical technician training program.

The Penetron will be available also to engineering students in the materials science program who are planning to transfer to UCLA and state colleges.








