

Entering second, Princess Pam Flemming rode in a car driven by Dennis Nasaki. Jack Tweedy was her escort. Princess Pam's dress was pale yellow.
Princess Janet Kimbrell greeted fans from her car driven by Richard Moore. Janet wore a blue dress and she was escorted by Mike Shinoda.
The fourth princess was Princess Dana Wolinsky. Dana's car was driven by Steve Horton and riding with her was her escort, Walter Hale. Princess Dana's dress was a bright pink.
THE FOUR court members passed the THS rosters and proceeded to the 50-yard line of the field, opposite Tartar sections. One by one the princesses and escorts proceeded to the center of the field. Each couple took places at the crown's points.
Following her princesses, was the entrance of the 1964 Homecoming Queen, Nanci Barnard wore the traditional white gown. She waved to fans from her car driven by Danny Williams, Alan Schwartz was Nanci's escort. They took their place on the field at the crown's tip.
Queen Sandra addressed the Torrance students and alumni from the field.
Assisting the ASB president, Alvin Sasuga, in presentations was Judi Rynhart, ASB vice president. The four princesses stepped to the center. The actual beginning of engraved plaques and roses.
Nanci was presented with a trophy, roses, and her scepter. The actual beginning of her reign was marked by the coronation, performed by Hall, manager. Hall succeeds Sandra McElhose. Surrounded by her court, Miss Nanci

Barnard became "Queen Nanci."
MEMBERS OF THE THS Pep Squad and Student Council formed an arch and reception line for the couples as they proceeded to the stands. A special section was reserved for the royal court in the center of Torrance High fans.
The hard-fought game was lost to the Eagles by a score of 33-6.
Following the game, a reception-dance was held at the Torrance Recreation Center. Princesses Sandy, Pam, Janet, and Dana were introduced.
Tartar varsity football captain Greg Barrett presented Queen Nanci with the traditional autographed football.
MUSIC WAS PROVIDED by the Esquires and the first dance was led off by the Queen and Greg, the princesses and their dates.
Planning for the dance was under the direction of Alan Schwartz, senior class president and the senior class council.
On behalf of the student body, I would like to thank Harold Klonecky, assistant principal, for his hard work in co-ordinating the Homecoming activities.
A great thank you also to THS' Girls' League for the flower-bedecked cars, the band, drill team, and pep squad for the impressive half-time ceremonies, and the senior class for a successful dance.
