## Top Cowboys Heading For National Finals

The National Rodeo Finals, coming up Dec. 1-6 at Los Angeles Sports Arena, will be marked by the toughest competitive battles for rodeo championships in the last decade.

This "world series" of rodeo action, which will see 88 of the world's top cowboys qualified to compete in the grand finale for 1964, will have all but the bareback bronc riding crown up for grabs.

With none of the National Rodeo Association riders slated for action again before the National Finals, titles will be decided at the Sports Arena in saddle bronc riding, bull riding, calf roping, steer wrestling and team roping.

WORLD TITLES are determined by dollar earnings during the entire year. In bareback bronc riding, Jim Houston, 23-year-old star from Omaha, has a virtual lock on the crown with a \$4668 edge on Jim Mihalek, 24, of Broomfield, Colo. The most a contestant could win in one event of the \$65,000 National Finals jackpot is a little over \$4000.

lead over Gary Gist, 19, of Lakeside, Calif.

The season's biggest money winner to date, Dean Oliver, 34, of Boise, Idaho, heads for the National Finals with total winnings this year of \$29,828.

THE LANKY Idahoan holds a \$3705 edge in the sweepstakes title chase on Montana's Benny Reynolds, but owns only a shaky \$677 lead in calf roping over southpaw speedster Ronny Sewalt, 23, of Chico, Tex.

There will be 15 entries in each of six events of the National Finals. And the cowboys will be facing the toughest stock on the rodeo circuit. The stock is all hand picked off performances during the season.

There will be nightly performances at the Sports Arena from Tuesday, Dec. 1, through Sunday, Dec. 6, with matinees on Saturday and Sunday.
