



Injury to Ron Taylor Stymies Varsity Quint

Figure on North High having another tough varsity basketball team this season. At full strength the Saxons will undoubtedly be a serious threat to repeat as Sky League champions. North High, it should be pointed out, made a clean sweep of the varsity, junior varsity, Bees and Cees a year ago. Returning to the line-up as a potent offensive and defensive weapon for North is Ron Taylor, the giant 6-foot, 11-inch senior letterman. Taylor gave Coach Skip Enger the scare of the season in the Pacific Shores Tournament Thursday when he seriously sprained his ankle and played only one minute against Mira Costa in a 73-62 loss. The night before Taylor tallied 26 points in a rally victory over Torrance, 55-53. But much to the delight of Enger was the way

the game turned in Friday against Santa Monica. The Saxons, without Taylor, led from wire to wire while footballer Don Albin connected for 20 points. The Saxons get a lot of work from Forward Bruce Troglin, a 6-5 senior with jayvee experience. Jess Jacobs, 6-2, shows plenty of rebounding ability. Guard Greg Shearer can shoot well from the floor, and Guard Greg Weinstrom handles the ball well. Coach Enger has taken a particular fancy for one of his top nine players, Dave Neilson, a 6-5 freshman, who played well in the first three games of the Pacific Shores tournament. In commenting on Taylor's injury, Coach Enger said the height center would be out of action without taking any chances for at least 10 days. There's a possibility Taylor will get off crutches and return to action for the Beverly Hills Tournament starting Wednesday, Dec. 16.

Torrance, 60-58

The Seahawks were fortunate Paul Hoffman was hot in their tournament game against Glendale. He scored 20 of the Hawks 30 points in the first half (30-23) and waited until the final minute of play to toss in a pair of free throws that wrapped up the victory. Mira Costa was paired in the finals with Redondo for the first time in the 13-year history of the tournament with a conquering 64-62 win over Palos Verdes. Costa was a little more fortunate in Round 2, beating North with Saxon ace Ron Taylor. TORRANCE schools bit the dust in three first round contests as Palos Verdes completely routed West, 85-54; El Segundo upset South, 43-39, and North came from behind to edge Torrance, 55-53. But in consolation play Torrance beat both Culver City, 62-39, and West, 60-58, to advance to the finals against Loyola.
