# Answer These Questions Before Buying Yule Toys

One of the most valuable things a Christmas giver can bestow on a child is safety—safety from injury producing toys and playthings. Now is the time for shoppers to plan to include this important ounce of prevention in each Christmas package for a child.

No one would give a toddler a sharp knife or a loaded gun to play with, but the wrong toys can sometimes be just as dangerous.

For every toy bought, the purchaser should have affirmatively answered these questions about it:

- Is it sturdily constructed and of good material;
- Is it one that will interest the child at his age and stage of development;
- Will he enjoy it over a period of time; and, most importantly
- Is it free from dangerous elements?

DANGEROUS elements for a young child include toys that can shatter, splinter, cut

or puncture; toys that are stuck together with wires and pins; ill-balanced mobile toys such as wobbly tricycles and wagons that may topple easily.

Babies must be expected to put toys into their mouths, so they should have sturdy washable objects that are too big to swallow and that can't be pulled apart and swallowed. To be avoided are toys with small removable parts, stuffed animals and dolls having glass or button eyes, and flammable objects.

Electrical toys given to children should be only those which bear the label of approval of the Underwriters' Laboratory, a nonprofit organization which tests for electrical safety. Also, no child should ever be permitted to have costumes or playthings that catch fire easily.

IF PARENTS wish to give older children such things as chemistry sets, dart games, bows and arrows and potentially dangerous tools or electrical gadgets, they should do so only if they plan to spend the necessary time to super-

vised closely the children's use of them.

Firearms, including air rifles and slingshots are not only undesirable—their use by any youngster is expressly prohibited by law in this area. Children are at the mercy of their parents in matters of their home surroundings. With a little extra thought and care on the part of adults, Christmas can be safe and merry for everyone.

A LEAFLET giving suggestions for safe gifts according to the ages of children is available from the health department.

## Mile High Pies Make Holidays Gay

Here are the most festive pies of the season — mile-high and high-spirited and gay as a Christmas tree. Chiffon pies like these are an American invention, re-

elegance—to say nothing of the good eating.

### NESSLEBRODE PIE

- 2 env. unflavored gelatin
- 3 cups milk
- 6 eggs, separated
- 1 cup chopped glace fruits and peels
- ¼ cup dark rum
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- Pinch salt
- ½ cup sugar
- 9-inch crumb shell
- Semi-sweet chocolate shavings

- 2 egg whites
- ½ cup sugar
- ¾ cup heavy cream, whipped stiff
- 9-inch ginger nut crumb shell
- ¼ tsp. nutmeg

Stir egg yolks, milk, salt and gelatin together and let stand 5 minutes. Cook over hot water in top of double boiler until custard coats the spoon.

Add bourbon and vanilla and cool, stirring often, until custard begins to set and mounds on spoon.

Beat the 6 egg whites until foamy; gradually beat in the sugar and beat stiff. Fold meringue into custard. Fold in whipped cream.

Chill until it begins to set. Pile into 9-inch ginger nut crumb shell and chill until firm. Sprinkle with nutmeg, garnish with more whipped cream, if desired.

### Ginger Nut Crumb Shell

Combine 1 cup ginger-snaps, ½ cup chopped nuts, 2 tablespoons sugar, ¼ cup melted butter. Press against bottom and sides of 9-inch pie plate and bake at 400 degrees for 7 minutes. Cool thoroughly before filling.
