Seizing an early first quarter lead, West High's Warriors marched to their second victory in a row against Bishop Montgomery Friday

night, 64-53. The non-league game was played before a first-night crowd in the new West High gymnasium.

The Warriors served notice they intend to be in on the race for the Pioneer League flag while handing Montgomery its third loss in four games.

It wasn't all apple pie for coach Tom Sutherland, however. "Pleick killed us," Sutherland lamented in the locker room. He was speaking of John Pleick, Montgomery's tall and heavy center, who scored 25 points on eight field goals and nine shots from the foul line.

Pleick also led the Knights in rebounding — and the Knights out-rebounded West, despite the 20 which center John Cochran hauled in for the Warriors. Cochran also scored 13 points before he fouled out of the game.

Pat Hall, who hit seven from the floor and added five more at the foul line for 16 points — high for a Warrior, and pulled in nine rebounds, also turned in top individual performances.

The Warriors will face Bell Gardens in a 3 p.m. game Tuesday. The game will be played at West High.

Torrance Wins in Basketball

Torrance High staged a mirror second half scoring spree to defeat Leuzinger High, 53-42, in a non-league basketball game played at West High Friday.

The Tartars left the court at half time with a 1-point deficit, but put together 16 and 18 point quarters in the last half to win their first non-tournament game of the season.

Torrance won the consolation bracket of the Pacific Shores Tournament, then suffered a 67-57 loss to North High.

Hughes Inherits 'Beaucoup Talent'

Rex Hughes is no stranger around Redondo High School. When he returned to his alma mater as varsity basketball coach this fall his credentials included an asterisk referring to him as the school's outstanding basketball player of the past.

That's pretty good reference for a school that has won or tied for a Bay League title in one division or another for the past 22 years.

In all probability the championship trend will be continued for at least one more year as Coach Hughes has inherited an ideal basketball aggregate in his first season at RUHS.

With everybody gunning for the forerunning Seahawks, Hughes says the biggest task his team must face is to work hard to avoid beating themselves.

"I expect them (Seahawks) to improve their showing in the recent Pacific Shores Tournament. There will be some pretty tough competition by the time the Bay League rolls around," Hughes said.

Only Harry Jenkins is gone from last year's

co-champion varsity (shared with Mira Costa), leav- Hughes with Paul Hoffman (6-5), Jeff Sims (6-6), Bob Clemo (6-5) and Dave Druliner (6-2) as first string returning talent.

The No. 6 man last year was Ray Woodfin, then a sophomore. He is about as good as they come as juniors and has shot up to 6'1".

Because of a good bench Woodfin will share his guard assignment with Dave Cole (5-11), a senior letterman, and Dave Cox, 5-10 junior who quarterbacked the Bee football team to an unbeaten, unscored upon Bay League season.

Tardy for early basketball workouts, Cox did not play a great deal in the tournament, but Hughes says the youngster will help the squad considerably.

Another junior who is on standby for the big boys is Carl Honigmann, a 6-5 former junior varsity player.

The biggest challenge for Redondo at the present time is winning the Beverly Hills Tournament this week, something the Hawks have not done in the more than 20 years of the event, not even in the playing days of Rex Hughes.

62-58 LOSS

Saxon Rally Fails

Ron Taylor returned to the North High line-up Friday night and scored 29 points against Pius X, but the Saxons lost the game on the "enemy court," 62-58.
