About 24 per cent of all stolen cars which are recov-ered are involved in acci-dents, according to Newsome. A reduction in auto thefts should produce a correspond-ing reduction in accidents, he added.

Both Newsome and Dolm-seth issued the following ad-vice to motorists:

- Lock your car and take the keys with you.
- Always park in a well-lighted area at night.
- Record the key numbers on your keys, then punch out the tags and destroy them.
- Spray ignition systems with plastic coating to pre-vent the use of jump coils.

Holidays and weekends are the most frequent times for auto thieves to work, Dolm-seth said. He also noted that most cars are stolen between 7 p.m. and midnight.

Nearly \$9 million in un-employment benefits was paid through the Torrance office of the State Depart-ment of Employment during 1964, Murray W. Love, local manager, told members of the Torrance Lions Club.

An average of \$8 million is paid each week on some 200,000 claims throughout California, Love said. The money is used for food, clothing, shelter, and utilities and helps the farmer, grocer, and manufacturer as well as the unemployed, he added.
