Garden Checklist

1. This is an important time for dormant spraying of fruit trees. Ask your nurseryman what to use and the easiest way to apply it.
2. Sweet peas may be planted now from seed. They are happiest with an early start so that they germinate while the weather is still cool. Dig a good trench and work manure into the soil before you sow the seeds.
3. You will still find a good selection of roses and fruit trees and other deciduous plants bare-root, but time is getting short.
4. Plant annuals such as stock, snapdragons, calendula and cineraria for spring bloom.
5. Plant flat grown perennials for spring and summer bloom. Give them a good start by preparing the soil well before planting.
6. Strawberries may be planted now for harvest in a few short months.

'Truth' Is Subject of Sunday Text
