Warren Tilson
Funeral services for Fireman Warren E. Tilson, 31, of Torrance, were held on Aug. 17 in Los Angeles. Tilson, a member of the Los Angeles Fire Department since 1959, died when a marquee fell on him.

Mr. Tilson was the first member of the fire department to die in action in more than four years. He was on duty in the South Los Angeles area during rioting in the area and was fighting one of the serious fires at the time of his death on Aug. 14. Fireman Tilson lived at 1161 Levinson St. He joined the Los Angeles Fire Department in 1959 and was stationed at Station No. 61, 5821 W. 3rd St.

He is survived by his widow, Carole, who expects their first child in about six weeks. Also surviving are his mother; four brothers, Thomas, William, and R. Worth of Texas and Daniel of San Jose, Calif.; and two sisters, Eugenia Bethard of Georgia and Grace Zabielski of Illinois.

Funeral services for John M. Minor of 24321 Falena Ave., will be held Friday at 2 p.m. in the McErney's Mortuary Chapel in Lomita. Mr. Minor, who was 78, died Tuesday in a Long Beach hospital.

Born in Illinois, Mr. Minor came to the Torrance area 43 years ago. He was employed at the Todd Shipyards as a shipbuilder until his retirement several years ago. Mr. Minor was a member of the Fleet Reserve Association and the Norfolk, Va., Masonic Lodge.

He is survived by two sons, Donald of Torrance and John of Spring Valley, Calif., and a daughter, Winona Cannon of Torrance. Also surviving are a sister, Elizabeth Dunbar, and six grandchildren. Interment will be in Green Hills Memorial Park.
