Employer payments of those itemized herein, as defined in Section 1771.1 of the Labor Code, are to be paid in accordance with the terms of the collective bargaining agreement applicable to the type or classification of the workmen or mechanics employed on the project. Overtime, Sundays and Holidays—no less than one and one-half (1 1/2) times the basic hourly rate plus applicable employer payments. The holidays upon which such rates shall be paid are all holidays recognized in the collective bargaining agreement applicable to the particular craft, classification or type of workman employed on the project.

Copies of all collective bargaining agreements relating to the work are set forth in the aforementioned Labor Code are on file and available for inspection in the office of the Department of Industrial Relations, Division of Labor Statistics and Research.

Attention is directed to Section 7-101G of the Standard Specifications providing for employment of apprentices on the work.
