

Area Adult Schools to Offer Varied Programs

Fall semester will begin at the Carson and Narbonne Adult Schools Sept. 13. Pre-registration dates are Sept. 7, 8 and 10. Counselors will be available at Carson from 6 to 9 on these evenings to assist in the planning of programs for persons working for high school diplomas. Evenings for counseling at Narbonne Adult School will be Sept. 7 and 10.

Varied courses will be offered in academic, business, homemaking, and industrial and trade courses. Academic courses will include U. S. History and Government, mathematics, algebra, English, literature, science, and seamanship. Business courses slated are business machines, bookkeeping, civil service preparation,

Program Aids Retired Military Personnel

Retiring military personnel may find the transition to civilian life less difficult in the future because of an active program now underway in California and every other state which has a major military installation. The nationwide program, known as the Cooperative Program for Employment Assistance to Military Personnel Scheduled for Retirement, is designed to help retiring military personnel find civilian jobs for which they are qualified.

According to June C. Roper, manager of the California Employment Service local office in Torrance, the program is "a cooperative effort between the Department of Labor's Bureau of Employment Security, the affiliated state employment security agencies, and the Department of Defense to facilitate adjustment of retirees from military to civilian jobs. This objective is being accomplished through employment orientation, counseling, testing, and placement assistance."

The program was prompted by the growing number of career military personnel retiring each year. A study of a group of May 1964 military retirees is being conducted for the Department of Labor by the Bureau of Social Science Research, Inc., Washington, D. C. Preliminary information from that study indicates that about 27 per cent of 504 officers and 21 per cent of 1,444 enlisted men studied were still unemployed 6 months after they were separated from the military services.

There are about 56,000 men and women retiring each year from military service. There are some 400,000 military retirees, but that figure is expected to increase sharply over the next 15 years to over a million.

"THE PROGRAM," the local office manager said, "will

give the retirees a realistic attitude about salaries and job duties, and the possible need for training. It is also designed to help overcome resistance on the part of some employers because of the age of most military retirees. The average retiree is in his early forties."

Military retirees generally fall into two categories: those who are well qualified for civilian occupations and have developed their own post-retirement plans, and those who possess primarily military occupational skills and need intensive assistance in preparation for civilian employment.

Mrs. Roper said that her office aims to prepare local military retirees to make the maximum use of their skills and capabilities, and, thus, to enable them to contribute to the nation's economy.

The project is divided into two parts. Phase I consists of a comprehensive briefing conducted at military installations in the state by skilled employment service personnel. This initial briefing includes up-to-date information on labor area conditions, the transfer of military skills to civilian occupations, and general problem areas which may be encountered in beginning a "second career" as a civilian.

The first employment briefing is scheduled well in advance of retirement to give the retiree sufficient time to plan for his post-retirement career.

Phase II involves direct employment assistance on an individual basis between the retiree and the Employment Service.

Military personnel stationed in California who plan to retire within the next 18 months should contact their base personnel officer for details about employment assistance which will be provided

Resident Participates In Launch of Gemini V

William W. Kern of Torrance had an important role in the development of the Gemini launch vehicle. As a member of the Gemini technical staff at Aerospace Corp. in El Segundo, he has responsibilities for monitoring the guidance and electronics systems to be certain that they operate as close to perfect as possible.

This was the fifth launch in the Gemini series and the longest manned flight to date. Astronauts Gordon Cooper and Charles Conrad stayed in orbit for eight days.

Aerospace's Gemini launch systems directorate is responsible for the general systems engineering and technical direction of Gemini-Titan launch vehicles. It is also responsible for the technical surveillance of the Agena target vehicles that will be used to perfect rendezvous and docking techniques in later flights. Rendezvous and docking, the joining of two orbiting spacecraft in flight, is the basis of all advanced manned space flight including men on the moon and supporting space stations.


