Eastern Railroad Merger Could Eliminate Red Ink

By REYNOLDS KNIGHT Railroad isn't the glamor industry it used to be when there was no air transportation industry and the automobile had yet to prove its reliability.

Nevertheless, its front-page news when a merger plan is suddenly announced for the formation of the nation's largest rail system, measured by mileage and revenues, Chesapeake & Ohio and Norfolk & Western would like to put into their proposed new system five other smaller lines in the north and east, four of which were described as being in serious financial difficulties.

One main objective of the plan is to form a second super-large system to compete with the proposed Pennsylvania-New York Central system. Gross revenues and total assets of the two combines would be comparable.

Estimates are that the proposed new system might effect a saving of \$75 million in a five- to ten-year period. This could be welcome news to some of the smaller lines that have seen altogether too much red ink in recent years.

AMMUNITION FOR INDUSTRY—Industrial tools may be using a new "caseless ammunition" energy source before long. Omak Industries, Inc., has been licensed exclusively to develop industrial tools using the no-cartridge ammunition developed by Daisy Manufacturing Co. for use in new-type rifles. The "ammunition" is a solid propellant that is set off by compressed air.

"We are convinced that this system can be applied to a good many industrial tools in cutting and fastening field," said Omak's president, John D. Gray. "There has been a long-standing industrial need for a low-cost, unitized, highly concentrated energy source adaptable to portable tools. We are now engaged in extensive research and development to explore the various areas of potential industrial application for this simple energy system," he stated.

Omak is the leading manufacturer of saw chain for power chain saws, and also makes power-actuated tools for the construction industry, saws and drills for cutting concrete, masonry and stone, and percussive welding equipment. It is a diversified maker of cutting and fastening products and systems, and has its headquarters in Portland, Ore.

BITS O' BUSINESS—Two large chemical companies announced price increases. Allied is raising the price of alum used in producing paper and in water purification, and Olin Mathieson is lifting the price of kraft boards used in making fiber drums that are widely used to store and ship chemicals. First shipments of Polaroid's \$20 black-and-white camera sell briskly in Canada. Camera's introduction date in the U.S. is nearly two months later. Gulf Oil says it has developed a new railroad diesel lubricating oil that could reduce right-of-way forest fires started by exhaust fumes. Look for total year's auto sales, including imports, to top 9 million. Machine tools such as lathes and presses will start appearing in bright colors.

instead of the conventional metal parts used today, a professor of architecture predicted recently. Prof. Walter H. Lewis, of the University of Illinois, told a home construction organization that in 20 years residential pipe and fixtures for personal hygiene and sanitation will consist essentially of plastic. This will include piping, fittings, welding of joints and even chrome-plated plastic fixtures and hardware, he said.

Lewis explained that a new ABS (acrylonitrile-butadiene-styrene) plastic formulation developed by Marbon Chemical Division of Borg-Warner can be electroplated effectively with chrome, nickel, gold and silver. In the bathroom alone, items will include chrome- or gold-plated plastic faucets, shower heads, lavatory trim, soap dishes, towel rods, cabinet trim and other applications, Lewis said. He added that cost studies by a fixture manufacturer indicated production savings as high as 30 per cent could be achieved by making a chrome-plated faucet out of Cycloc ABS instead of metal.
