**Use of Fire Units as Ambulances Suggested**

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn has asked the Chief Administrative Officer and County Fire Chief Keith Klinger to report on equipping fire rescue units as emergency ambulances.

Hahn feels that if some fire equipment were equipped to transport persons to hospitals it would cut duplication of emergency equipment responding in many cases. He pointed out that in drowning and heart attack cases, the Fire Department, from its stations located at key spots throughout the County, is usually the first on the scene.

Yet, after this first response, valuable minutes are lost waiting for an ambulance to transport the victim to the nearest hospital," he noted.
