
WHAT'S DOING?

This brain cell provides "memory" for a new telephone switching system which someday will make it possible for you to set up conference calls yourself, use abbreviated numbers for calls you make often and to have your incoming calls transferred to another number. Back in 1955 in Americus, Georgia, the Bell Solar Battery began its first trial in actual service on a rural telephone line. Ten years later, the Solar Battery is used as a source of power on many of today's space satellites.


