Charge for Legal Forms Studied by Supervisors

A proposal to charge lawyers for legal forms furnished by taxpayers of Los Angeles County has won support from Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

Hahn said today he will urge the Board of Supervisors to approve a recommendation from the County Clerk to charge lawyers for the forms. Cost of the forms will be one cent each.

"Anyone who receives special forms should pay for them," Hahn said. "The rest of the property owners should not subsidize any group."

The Los Angeles County Bar Association has asked for a study of the proposal. At-

torney Richard Oliver will make the Bar Association's presentation to the supervisors.

County taxpayers pay more than \$30,000 a year for the legal forms, Hahn noted.

He said most of the cost is "pure waste" by attorney's who take more forms than needed or do not use the forms carefully. More than 9,000 attorneys have received the forms free of charge in the past, Hahn said.

"I strongly urge that this one facet of the waste of taxes can readily be balanced by a small charge," Hahn said, "as well as stop the actual physical waste of these forms."

Contractor Penalized For Delays

The county this week levied a \$1,750 penalty against the contractor on a Redondo Beach job for failure to complete it on schedule.

Supervisor Chairman Burton W. Chace said the project involved the drilling of 19 recharge wells to prevent sea water infiltration of fresh water wells.

The contract was handled as a joint venture by Ted R. Gregory and the Tereidon Co., Long Beach. Chace said the contractor ran 35 days beyond the completion date, despite county extensions of 179 days due to cave-ins and bad weather.

Penalties were recommended by the Flood Control District.
