## Additional Work Okayed On Channel

An additional payment of \$20,000 for extra work required on the final unit of the Dominguez Channel Improvement north of Carson has been authorized by the County Supervisors.

The action was recommended by County Flood Control District Chief Engineer Walter J. Wood, whose agency is supervising construction on the project.

It is being built by Peter Kiewit Sons' Co. of Arcadia under terms of a contract awarded Aug. 4, 1964.

Bulk of the additional money will pay for constructing an outlet into the channel at 190th Street for 1964 storm drain bond issue project number 1206, Hahn said. Limit of the current contract runs from Avalon Boulevard to Vermont Avenue and, when completed, will furnish the entire 18-mile project which extends from International Airport to the ocean.


Penalty and interest charges will be added if the report is filed after the deadline, Nebergall said.
