## Punishment Is Subject Of Lesson

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## ... Let's Go

In the article that I sent back from Hong Kong, I did not mention the "island" of Macao that is 40 miles from Hong Kong. I faintly remember a movie by that name with Humphrey Bogart in it. A movie of gambling, vice, and intrigue — so naturally most of my tour groups wanted to see it — just for the intrigue of course.

Macao (The Portuguese spell it with a "u") is a Portuguese Colony with its own Governor and because it borders on Red China, many refugees from communism have escaped to Hong Kong through Macao. Their reasons for escaping are many — starvation conditions for some — yet Macao receives all of her food and water from Red China.

I saw the Red Chinese patrol boat in the opening of the South River that skirts Macao and it was plain to see that any suspicious craft coming or going would be investigated. Yet the word does come down that many refugees escape by boat to Macao and freedom — but it must surely be by night and by small boats.

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gees on Macao is to get to Hong Kong and get a job, as industries there are booming. The traffic between Macao and Hong Kong is heavy across the Sea of Nine Islands. The waters are covered with junks of all descriptions — mostly families that are fishing — but also a good way to get smuggled into Honk Kong or Kowloon. The going rate for being smuggled into Hong Kong is about 100 patacas, roughly \$17. This money probably will be furnished by friends or relatives who have already made the jump to Hong Kong.

Gambling is a big sport on Macao. There are several casinos already in operation and I saw a huge new one being built. Having been to the plush gambling dens in Las Vegas and Monte Carlo, it was my "duty" to at least look in on the notorious dens of chance in Macao.

The air conditioning inside was pleasant and the place was packed. Mostly Chinese and lots of gambling going on in games that I had never seen in the Western world. I tried my luck trying to guess how many beans the dealer would throw out on the green felt table. I lost of course. I tried their "one-arm bandits" and I just had to see where they were manufactured — it was good to see "made in Las Vegas, Nevada" stamped on the back.

## Torrance B'nai B'rith Lodge Marks Birthday

The Torrance Lodge will cut a cake for members, guests from other lodges, and non-members residing in the local area who wish to attend tomorrow at Temple Menorah, 1101 Camino Real. The program will begin at 8 p.m.

B'nai B'rith lodges throughout the world currently are observing the 122nd anniversary of the founding of the largest Jewish service organization in the world.

Dr. Lester Sacks, president of the Torrance Lodge, said tomorrow's program will mark "B'nai B'rith's 122 years of enduring contributions to community enlightenment and human progress."

"In our first year our lodge has grown and performed in this same tradition," Dr. Sacks said, "and we celebrate at this time with full recognition of the challenges and opportunities still ahead."

The name B'nai B'rith is from the Hebrew meaning "Sons of the Covenant," Dr. Sacks said, and is representative of the covenant received by Moses at Mount Sinai.
