
The announcement was made at the semi-annual Sweetheart Ball when she was crowned by Miss Wendy Freeland, the retiring chapter sweetheart.

Rev. C. Black conducted the marriage as Janet Skaggs played the nuptial music. Carol Dykes was soloist.


A champagne reception and buffet was held at the VFW hall in Gardena.
