

**Cancer Society Sets Workshop**

News of the latest progress in cancer detection and prevention will be featured in the luncheon address by Robert Randle, M.D., at the Tuesday workshop for Centinela Valley-South Bay area volunteers of the American Cancer Society.

Focal point of the workshop will be the importance of the volunteer in the society's year-round program of service to cancer victims and of public education. Mrs. Jack Ansley, chairman of the workshop, urges all area American Cancer Society volunteers to attend the workshop and to bring their interested friends and neighbors as well.

Dr. Randle, director of medical education at Huntington Memorial Hospital in Pasadena, serves as chairman of the Pasadena-West San Gabriel Valley District Council of the American Cancer Society, to underscore his conviction that the volunteer is of vital importance in the fight against cancer.

Following the workshop, John Simpson, District Eight crusade chairman, will preside over the luncheon program and introduce Dr. Randle.

Allan K. Jonas, Los Angeles County vice president for program and chairman of the division fund-raising committee, will offer a summary of workshop sessions.

**National Group Seeks Pearl Harbor Survivors**

Efforts of the Pearl Harbor Survivors Association to locate as many military survivors of the attack on Pearl Harbor have been intensified in preparation for a 25th anniversary memorial service. Joseph T. Paul, state chairman, has announced.

The association plans a reunion in Honolulu, Hawaii, on Dec. 7, 1966, for a 25th anniversary memorial service.

More than 10,000 servicemen who survived the attack have been located, Paul said, but the association believes as many as 40,000 more survivors still are living. Paul said servicemen who were stationed on the island of Oahu or on board a ship within three miles of the island during the attack on Pearl Harbor should write to the Pearl Harbor Survivors Association, Room 5, Jefferson Building, 101 E. High St., Jefferson City, Mo. 65101.
