

Committee Studies State School Plan

Now that our recent special session has been reverently wrapped and laid away in the archives of California history, our various fact finding, interim, and joint committees are resuming their tasks of investigation and preparation for the 1967 regular session. In the meantime, of course, we will convene for the 1966 budget session, and anticipate that some urgent items may be brought before us in a concurrent special session.

During the regular session which adjourned in June, a Joint Committee on Higher Education was created. It is composed of five Senators and five Assemblymen, and \$100,000 was appropriated for its needs.

The resolution which established the group specifically directed it to study and analyze all the facts relating to the development of higher education under the state's Master Plan for Higher Education from 1960 to 1965, and to determine what changes, if any, should be made in the Master Plan to meet the needs of higher education through 1980.

MANY EDUCATORS and other competent observers regard the legislative enactment of the Master Plan as the most significant accomplishment of the 1960 special session. The extent to which the plan has been copied or paralleled by other states is some evidence of its pioneering impact. The fruit of many months of painstaking effort, and many political compromises, the plan virtually put an end to the unnecessary and

expensive competition between the various public institutions of higher learning by spelling out the functions of the University, the state colleges, and the junior colleges without setting up a rigid constitutional structure.

The plan also facilitates cooperation between all such institutions, minimizes duplication, and eases the burden of educating the thousands of additional students who will de-

mand higher education in the future. However, as our 1965 resolution points out, the Legislature has not made a comprehensive review of the Master Plan and its operation since 1960, and there is now considerable evidence that estimates of future growth needs made then are no longer realistic. A reappraisal of the whole program therefore seems advisable.

ONE MAJOR change made by the Master Plan was separation of the top administration of the system of state colleges from the Department of Education. A new Board of Trustees to govern the colleges was created, to take over in July, 1961. This change was made to give these institutions the same broad guidance and academic freedom originally given the

University through its Board of Regents. The Joint Committee on Higher Education has recently announced that the cooperation of more than 250 educators, campus leaders, and others concerned with higher education has been requested in the formulation of areas for research by the Committee staff. Public hearings will probably not be scheduled until a broad program of re-


Presidents Carl L. Rogers and Dr. Jack McLaughlin of the chamber and coordinating council, said the affair is open to the public and urged




