**TURKEY TALK**  
Harvest dinners claiming a Pilgrim heritage will be festively served Thanksgiving day, beginning at 11:30 a.m., at the Smith Bros. Indian Village Restaurant in Torrance, a truly appropriate setting for enjoying America's most famous feast.  
Heading the holiday menu will be Plymouth Rock Turkey, bountifully adorned with Pilgrim dressing and other old-fashioned trimmings. The complete feast is 3.50 wampum, while children's dinners are 2 wampum.  
Thanksgiving dinners at the Indian Village Restaurant also will include Prime Rib. Early reservations are advised by manager Mrs. Virginia Smith Haack, who has arranged for the waitresses to be costumed in dresses such as once worn by Priscilla during her courtship days with John Alden and Miles Standish.

In keeping with the spirit of the joyful occasion, a copy of the original Thanksgiving Proclamation, made by Gov.
