## Headquarters Of Shell Co. To Be Moved

Headquarters of the Shell Chemical Co.'s synthetic rubber division will be moved from Torrance to New York by the middle of next year, according to J. B. Henderson, general manager.

The move will affect about 30 staff members involved in the division's administrative and planning functions.

The more than 900 employees of the research and technical service laboratories and the rubber manufacturing plant itself will remain at Torrance.

"The change concentrates Shell Chemical management at one location, placing the company in a stronger competitive position," Henderson said.
