

Pale blue was the color chosen by Princess Sharon Coffee. She rode in a car driven by Bill Bartholomew and was escorted by Jim Cucci.

Richard Thompson escorted Princess Judi Rynhart. Wearing a gown of pale pink, she rode in a car driven by Steve Mahoney.

AS THE FIVE princesses proceeded to their places within the heart, the 1965 Homecoming Queen, Cheryl Barnett entered the field. Riding in a car driven by Mike Haynes, Cheryl wore the traditional white gown. Her escort was Tom Waddell. After each of the princesses had received roses and an engraved plaque, outgoing Queen Nanci Barnard stepped forward to address the THS students and alumni. She

then crowned Cheryl as the 1965 Homecoming Queen. Cheryl was presented a trophy, roses, and a scepter. With this part of the ceremonies completed, Queen Cheryl began her reign.

The court then proceeded to a special section in the stands. From here they joined the rest of the THS rooters to cheer the Tartar Varsity on to a 13-7 upset over the Morningside Monarchs.

FOLLOWING the game, a dance was held at the Torrance Recreation Center. The royal court was introduced, and Varsity co-captain Bob Sharpe presented Cheryl with the traditional autographed football.

The Queen, her court, and their dates led off the first dance to the music of George Anderson's Esquires. Hosting the dance was the Class of 1966.


