Hawthorne Christian School Enrolls 130

One hundred and thirty students from kindergarten through eighth grade are attending the new Hawthorne Christian School on a three and one-half acre campus in Ray Watt's new community of Palo del Amo Woods.

Parents still have the opportunity to enroll their children for fall classes. "Although the fall semester has begun it is the policy of our school to accept stu-

dents for enrollment at any time throughout the school year. It is not necessary to wait until a new semester begins," the Rev. Carl Pike, founder and president of the schools, said.

THE MAJORITY of students at the Hawthorne Christian School reside in Palo del Amo Woods, but residence there is not a requirement for enrollment.

The Hawthorne Christian School offers a broad curriculum with special emphasis on new scientific technologies. A \$25,000 mobile science unit is used for specialized courses that the usual classroom is not equipped to handle. Programs in data processing using the latest IBM equipment are scheduled. Exhibits from the country's most prominent electronics and aerospace companies

will become a part of this unique traveling classroom.

Government Official To Speak on Viet Nam

John W. Piercy, chief of the conferences and speaking arrangements division of the United States Department of State, will speak to social science classes at Torrance High

School Wednesday, Dec. 1. Piercy will discuss "United States Foreign Policy in Viet Nam."

Born in Missouri, Piercy was educated in Kansas and received his bachelor's degree in sociology from the University of Kansas. He entered the Foreign Service in 1951 and was first assigned to The Hague, The Netherlands.

Piercy also has served in Oslo, Norway, and has been stationed at the Department of State Headquarters in Washington, D. C., during recent years.

He also has worked for the U. S. Department of Agriculture and served as co-chairman of the food conservation program for the War Food Administration during the Second World War.

Paint Firm Hits Sales, Profit High

New sales and profit records were established by Standard Brands Paint Co. for the fiscal year which ended Sept. 30, according to a report just released by the firm.

Sid Greenberg, president of the company, said sales were up 13 per cent to \$23,784,256. Earnings after taxes increased 12 per cent to \$1,640,495.

Earnings are equal to \$1.34 per share, based on 1,225,732 common shares outstanding as of Sept. 30, Greenberg said. Fiscal 1964 earnings amounted to \$1.21 per share.

"The company currently is enjoying a very strong level of sales," Greenberg said. "We believe we are in an extremely favorable position to increase our sales and earnings during the current fiscal year."
