Trio Due In Court For Bets

Three Torrance men arrested Thanksgiving Day will be arraigned Tuesday morning in South Bay Municipal Court on felony bookmaking charges.

The trio was arrested by Torrance vice division officers shortly before noon Thursday at Filippone's Restaurant, 4525 Calle Mayor.

Taken into custody were the owner, Salvatore (Sam) Filippone, 34; William Delgado, 36, the bartender, and an unemployed bartender, William Joseph Holt, 35, of 21013 Ladeene St.

The three men are charged with operating an "extremely lucrative" bookmaking business.

Sgt. Lee Ashman, commander of the Torrance vice division, said the arrests ended a months-long investigation which began when "irate wives" complained that their husbands were losing money betting on both professional and amateur sports contests.

A number of "betting markers" were seized in the raid, Sgt. Ashman reported.

All three men were released on writs pending their appearance in Division 3 of the South Bay Municipal Court Tuesday.

All parents of Chadwick students and their friends have been invited to attend the fair, according to Headmaster Pierson F. Melcher.


Purpose of the fair, according to Melcher, is "to help stimulate a greater desire for reading and the love of reading in children."

(Continued from page 1) but he was quoted as saying, "Yeah, I hit her with my fists. I kicked . . . her. Did you save the corpse?"

Under questioning by Detective Myles Hamilton Friday morning, Riddle said, "I don't remember anything except kicking her once."

THE 27-YEAR-OLD accountant, employed by the Garret Corporation's AirResearch Division, told officers he had picked his mother up at Los Angeles International Airport about 8 p.m. Thursday and returned to the Torrance apartment.

"We had a few drinks and discussed our family problems," Riddle told officers. "All of a sudden she cracked under the emotional strain."

Police said they had telephoned the woman's husband in Wisconsin but he could give no reason for the attack. He was reported flying to California.
