In the boundary shifts, Hahn added, 82,000; Chace picked up 63,000; Warren Dorn, 34,000; and Ernest Debs, 142,000.

Long Beach City Councilman Emmet M. Sullivan led the five-member commission which drew up the new boundary lines and recommended the changes to the Board.
