Social Security Office Extends December Hours

Additional office hours for December have been established by the Torrance Social Security district office. Miles Davis, manager, announced today.

Davis said the Torrance office, located at 1408 Crenshaw Blvd., will remain open from 8:30 a.m. until 8:30 p.m. on Wednesdays, Dec. 8, 15, and 22. In addition, the office will open from 8:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. on Saturdays, Dec. 4, 11, and 18.

The new hours are in addition to regular hours of 8:30

a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Mondays through Fridays, Davis said.

THE EXTRA hours have been established to permit persons unable to visit the office during the regular business day to complete forms for the "medicare" program, Davis said.

Davis said everyone who is now 65 or will be 65 by March 31, 1966, should contact his office and complete the application for medicare without delay if:

- They have never filed an

application for social security because they are still working.

- Have a social security number but have worked very little or not at all.
- Have never had a social security number.

PERSONS NOW over 65 receiving monthly social security benefit checks do not need to take any action to be eligible for medicare, Davis said, except to complete and return a card which already has been mailed to them.
