

# Legislative Groups Begin Interim Work

During the weeks immediately ahead, the huge number of legislative problems referred to interim study will occupy our time and attention. The 15 Senate Fact Finding Committees, the 25 Assembly Interim Committees, and the 10 Joint Legislative Committees will be busy, digging out the facts about the problems assigned them, holding hearings, and collecting material for inclusion in the reports they will eventually prepare for submission to the 1967 regular session.

Already some 20 meetings have been scheduled to be held between now and the end of the year. Others will be added to the list as committee chairmen, members, and staff complete their preparations. Every member of both houses will be involved in the work, and travel schedules will be heavy for many.

As I have written in this column before, this program of interim legislative activity serves two exceedingly useful purposes in help us develop sound legislation for the guidance of our state and local governmental agencies.

FIRST, it enables us to devote more time to the study of the complex or controversial problems assigned to the committees than we could possibly do while we are in session. Second, because our committees will be meeting in every section of the state, it will give citizens and organizations an on-the-spot opportunity to present their facts and opinions about legislative matters of particular concern to them.

As you read this, the Senate Committee on Water Resources will be holding a two-day hearing. Its primary purpose will be an examination of potential sources of additional water supplies to meet the future needs of our state.

A few days later, the Senate Fact Finding Committee on Agriculture will consider legislation on hide and brand control which is of great importance to California's valu-

able livestock industry. Two bills relating to this subject introduced in the 1965 regular session have been referred to the group for study.

THE ASSEMBLY Interim Committee on Agriculture has scheduled a hearing and field trip on housing for agricultural workers and the part which public authorities can take in developing such housing. Every agriculturist in the state has a personal interest in this matter, and in its effect on the farm labor supply.

The Higher Education Subcommittee of the Assembly Education Committee will meet to consider the need for

additional scholarships for students enrolled in our institutions of higher learning. Also on its agenda is the controversial matter of tuition to be charged for attendance at California's collegiate facilities. Recently enacted federal legislation will have a great effect on both these matters.

A SUBCOMMITTEE of the Assembly Judiciary Committee will hold a two-day meeting on the complex problems involved in press and broadcast coverage of court trials. Every communication medium in the state has a direct concern with this subject, and this hearing will be closely watched.


