No admission will be charged for either concert. "We feel that the concert is our gift to the community during the holiday season," Mrs. Jane Hardester, choral director, explained.

Conducting the instrumental portions of the program will be Calvin Greer, El Camino music instructor.

SELECTIONS in the presentation will include Bach's Cantata No. 142 "For Us a Child is Born," "Jubilate Deo" by Roland de Lassus, excerpts from Benjamin Britten's "A Ceremony of Carols," "Ave Maria" by Igor Stravinsky, and Daniel Pinkham's "Festival Magnificat."

Featured also is the Tenor Trio performing "The Wise Men from the East" from "The Christmas Story" by Heinrich Schultze.

A trumpet ensemble will open the program with choral fanfare by Ron Nelson.
