Physicist Invited to Contribute to History

One of the most avid students of science and the men who have furthered scientific knowledge will himself take a place among "members of the scientific community who have made important contributions to 20th century physics."

At the invitation of the American Institute of Physics, in cooperation with the National Service Foundation, Julius Summer Miller, El Camino College instructor, international television personality and the Professor Wonderful of Disney productions, will contribute extensively to the project on the history of physics.

Included among data which Miller has been requested to submit are a biographical history, articles and papers published in professional journals, lectures presented throughout the world, book reviews, photography, and a summary of the material which appears in "American Men of Science," of which he is a member.

Added to this large collection will be copies of audio tape recordings which the El Camino College instructor has made in such television series as "Great Moments of Science," the BBC Memorial lecture on Newton and programs performed throughout the world.

Commenting upon the recognition extended him, Miller, also listed in "Who's Who in America," observes, "My work . . . has been principally on demonstrations in physics. To these matters I have given 30 years of devotion and hard work. It is a singular reward to me to have this labor of mine regarded as an important contribution to 20th century physics."

Among the most prominent words included in the colorful Miller vocabulary is "work." A popular refrain is directed toward his younger colleagues and students. In analyzing years of labor and, more recently, worldwide acclaim, Miller concludes, "If this event and others to which I now fall heir have any virtue for my students and for my younger colleagues, it lies in this respect—I have known nothing but hard work."

"Further," the outspoken instructor philosophizes, "the virtue of being prepared needs no discussion. I have been gathering up and storing away in my soul and in my spirit for half a century and now it has its reward."

Hahn Opposed to Idea Of Metro Police Force

Opposition to the creation of a single metropolitan police force for Los Angeles County has been voiced by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

Hahn said he strongly favors local home rule in matters of police protection. "I would urge the retention of local police departments under the home rule basis by local cities through their city councils and mayors," the supervisor said.

Expansion of existing joint powers agreements between local cities and wider use of a centralized county-wide records keeping system were urged by Hahn in his statement.

Two City Employes Win Posts

Two Torrance city employes have won key positions on the Executive Board of the Southern California Council 20, American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO.

J. D. Cahill, city garage mechanic and president of the Torrance Miscellaneous City Employes Local 1117, won the post of treasurer in a run-off election.

Account clerk Pauline Greer, a first-time candidate, was unopposed for a seat on the Executive Board.

The seven-man board will serve for the coming year. More than 5,000 persons are members of the organization. Council 20 represents public employes in Los Angeles County.
