## Guard Plan Approved for Selected Reserve Forces

Lieutenant General Rod-eric L. Hill, The State Adjutant General, announced today that the Department of Defense had approved the California National Guard's plan for organization in Southern California of a Battalion of infantry and two company-size units as part of the Hawaii National Guard's 29th Brigade, a Selected Reserve Force.

He said the 4th Battalion, 160th Infantry with headquarters at Long Beach had been designated a SRF organization and has begun its accelerated training program of 72 training assemblies a year, an increase of 24. Objective of the intensified training is to bring SRF units to a high level of combat readiness at home stations, General Hill said.

IN ADDITION to the headquarters company at Long Beach, subordinate SRF units of the 4th Battalion, 160th Infantry are: Company A, Santa Ana; Company B, Fullerton; Company C, Glendale. Also designated to be part of Hawaii's 29th Brigade are Troop E, 1st Squadron, 111th Cavalry, San Diego and the


