

New Jets Ordered By Mexico

Aeronaves de Mexico, the Mexican national airline, has placed an order with the Douglas Aircraft Co. for three four-engined DC-8 jet transports and nine twinjet DC-9 aircraft.

Announced orders for the DC-8 have now reached 312, while 228 DC-9s have been ordered and 142 are on option. A total of 243 DC-8s have been delivered.


