direct descendant of Commodore Stephen Decatur of the U.S. Navy's clash with Tripoli pirates fame. The first of the Parsons had come from England in 1635 and founded the town of Northampton, Mass., in 1645. Most of his lineage were Harvard graduates and practiced medicine in the New England states.

FOLLOWING the death of her husband in 1914, Mrs. Fraser served for 10 years in Napa Valley, Calif., as confidential secretary and interpreter for General Juan Trinidad Alamillo, a former governor of and national senator from the state of Colima of Mexico. He had also been jefe politico of Guadalupe, Jalisco, and a revolutionary leader associated with the late Presidente Obregon of Mexico.

With the completion of requirements for the California teaching credential at the University of California and the Southern Branch in Los Angeles (now UCLA) she joined the faculty of the James A. Foshay Junior High School near Exposition Park in 1925. At that school she taught Spanish for 22 years as well as adult education classes at Manual Arts High School. During this time she received in 1930 her California Life Diploma in Spanish and her M.A. degree in Education from the University of Southern California in 1928.

SURVIVORS of Mrs. Fraser include a son Robert M. Fraser of Torrance and Lee Vining, Calif., also a Stanford graduate, who taught and coached aquatic sports at Palo Alto Senior High School for twenty-eight years and is a retired lieutenant-commander, U.S.N.R. His eldest son, a Stanford graduate, is Jack Fraser, manager of the north Santa Clara County office of the San Jose Mercury-News. Other grandchildren are Gordon Fraser, an artist of Los Altos, Calif.; Susan Fraser Lutz, wife of a San Diego City Schools' instructor; and Charlotte Fraser now attending Foothill College in Santa Clara County. There are three nephews, William R. Knapp of San Francisco and Pebble Beach, manager of the Falstaff Brewery in San Jose; Gordon Knapp, a commercial real estate developer of Atherton, and James Powell of Lockheed Aerospace, Sunnyvale and three great-grandchildren.

All three sisters, Mabel Knapp of San Francisco; Eva Powell of San Jose and Clara McKibben of Stockton, continue to reside in northern California. Because of this, and at Mrs. Fraser's request, there will be no local services conducted. A private family memorial service will be held later in northern California. Former students or colleagues and friends of her are requested by the family to remit contributions to the Maud Fraser Memorial Fund in care of the Torrance Educational Association, 1623 Cravens, Torrance, in lieu of cards or flowers. The Fund will provide additions to the library at the Torrance High School.

year. He used to sponsor a holiday party.
The girls decided that somehow they would manage to see that every stomach was full and that at least some of the children had shoes on their feet for Christmas. By enlisting the aid of their principal, Henry Behrens, they were able to collect enough clothing from fellow-students to fill three trucks.
"We still need more shoes, socks, and soap. But at least we've made some headway," they said. "We're going to keep accepting donations until we leave."

last night by asking the council for some "guidance" on the direction which the committee should take. "Are we going in the proper direction?" he asked.

Ferraro noted the section of the resolution setting up the duties of the committee was "rather broad," and said overlapping areas of responsibility were hard to coordinate. Jealousies of other city groups are involved, too, Ferraro said.

ONE COMMITTEE member, reading from minutes of a meeting, called attention to conflicting advice from Ferraro and a member of his staff. Ferraro chastized the committee for its failure to use individual initiative to get background materials, while the staff member apparently told the group to communicate with city officials only through the office of the city manager, she said.
"Everybody is busy watching everybody else," Councilman H. Ted Olson said. "We all want the same thing."
Olson sees the picture from both sides. He sits as a member of a county advisory group which is identical to the Citizens Advisory Committee for Community Improvement in Torrance.

"I DON'T SEE any problem here at all," Ross A. Sciarrotta Sr. said. "There is some overlapping on all city commissions. We're going to make the final decision. There should be no limits on the committee."
"I disagree," Ken Miller said. "We haven't solved anything," Miller said the reso-

Food Stamp Coupon Books To Be Available Thursday

The U. S. Department of Agriculture Food Stamp Plan will be put into operation tomorrow when food stamp books will become available in the area Bureau of Public Assistance offices.

The program, operated nationally by the Consumer and Marketing Service of the USDA, is principally designed to help people eat better and to distribute the products of America's agriculture to those who need them most.

Operation of the program is simple. Families and individuals determined to be in economic need of food assistance may participate in the program on a voluntary basis. Through the food stamp books, families receiving public assistance or having certain income limits may purchase food stamps and receive bonus stamps for food purchases. In effect, one an-

nouncement said, a family in some cases may receive a food coupon worth \$1 at a cost of about 70 cents.
The food coupons can be spent at most markets as money, the market redeeming them through the Food Stamp Plan. The coupons may be spent for food products of the United States, but not for imported foods.
The food coupons may not be used to purchase other household items such as soaps, paper products, cleaners, beauty aids, alcohol beverages, or tobacco, officials say.

Information in the Food Stamp Plan is available at the Los Angeles County Bureau of Public Assistance offices in the area. Local offices are located at 322 W. Compton Blvd., Compton; 12735 S. Hawthorne Blvd., Hawthorne; and at 1917 Long Beach Blvd., Long Beach.






