## SACRAMENTO REPORT

# New State Curbs on Communists Sought

The recent decision of the United States Supreme Court holding that even known communists do not have to register as such with the federal government, in compliance with federal laws, has caused many people to write to me, asking what can be done by the State of California at least to restrict the activities of communists, and what has been done in the past.

There is considerable doubt among eminent California lawyers as to what can be done during the forthcoming budget session of 1966, which begins on Feb. 1, 1966, and lasts for 30 legislative (working) days. One reason for your doubt is that the State Constitution prevents us from introducing any bill not relating to the budget unless the Governor places the subject matter of such bill in the

proclamation calling the legislature into Extraordinary Session.

If you have what you consider to be sound, practical methods for restricting the activities of communists and their allies, write to Governor Edmund G. Brown, State Capitol, Sacramento 14, Calif., and asked him to issue a proclamation in 1966 calling the Legislature into Extraordinary (Special) Session for the purpose of enacting anti-communist legislation. He will be glad to get your requests, I hope.

SEVERAL THINGS have been done in past sessions of the California Legislature to restrict the activities of communists. For example, during the general session of 1953, I introduced my Assembly Bill No. 52. It was passed by both house of the Legislature, signed by the Governor, and became known then as Chap-

ter 1217, Statutes of 1953. It is still in the Statutes of California and has not been challenged successfully.

My law provides that no person who teaches or advocates the overthrow of the government of the State of California, or overthrow of the government of the United States of America, by force, by violence, or by other unlawful means, can register to vote in California, or be a candidate for any public office in California.

Please notice that the law does not mention the Communist Party, U.S.A.; communists, fellow-travelers, etc. It would be foolish to refer to communists by any sort of name, or the name of any organization. If that were done, they could simply change the name of their organization and safely disregard the law.

INCIDENTALLY, the same law can be invoked in Cali-

fornia against the Nazi party, Fascists, or any similar organization or group, or its individual members, but it must be proved that such persons do, in fact, commit the act or acts which render them ineligible to vote or be candidates for public office.

The above is what might be termed a prohibitory type of law, that is, it forbids and prohibits the right to vote or be a candidate for office on the part of certain citizens if they do certain acts. The opposite type of law seeks to guide people into right thinking and right acting by an educational process.

AN EXAMPLE of this type of legislation is found in the Education Code, Section 7901, which reads as follows:

"Courses in history and government. In all public and private schools located within the State, there shall be given regular courses of

instruction in the Constitution of the United States, and in American history, including the study of American institutions and ideals, and of the principles of State and local government established under the Constitution of this State."


All of the above was the result of a bill I introduced except that at the time I introduced the bill American history already was a required subject. My law was originally found in Sections 10051, 10052, and 10053 of the Education Code but the Sections were rearranged and re-numbered in order to group similar topics together.

THE PRESENT Section 7901 is under the heading: "Specified Required Courses of Study."

The Education Code consists of three large, bound volumes published and sold by two publishing houses, the

West Publishing Co., St. Paul, Minn.; and Bancroft Whitney Publishing Co. of San Francisco. The State of California does not have anything to do with the sale of the Education Code, or any portions of it.
