Italian Added To Curriculum

Classes in the Italian language will be offered at El Camino College for the first time when the spring semester begins. Dr. Lee Swanson, dean of communications, announced today.

Dr. Swanson said the new course will be offered "on a trial basis." If sufficient numbers of students are interested, he added, the course will be continued in the fall semester.

Italian is the fifth modern language to be offered for credit at the college.

Dr. Jeannette Campiglia, language instructor, headed the committee which has worked for two years to organize the curriculum for Italian I. The committee has prepared course materials, evaluated textbooks, and surveyed student interest.

INITIALLY, the college plans to offer two classes in Italian I, accommodating 75 students. Dr. Campiglia will teach one class at 10 a.m. and Mrs. Florence Marzlak will

teach the other class, to be given at 1 p.m.

Classes will meet Monday through Friday. In addition, all students will be required to spend at least one hour each week in the language laboratory.

The course will give the student an opportunity to acquire a basic practical vocabulary and provide practice in grammar, reading, writing, and speaking.

PREREQUISITE for the course is a passing grade on the English placement examination or the successful completion of English A.

General registration for the spring semester at El Camino begins Feb. 2, 1966. New or former full-time students should contact the college registration office as early as possible to secure appointments for registration and counseling.

The office is open from 8 a.m. until 9 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Friday hours are from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m.
