

Chapel Choir Singing Christmas Tree To Present Yule Concert

Presentation of a Christmas concert by the Chapel Choir of the First Baptist Church has been scheduled for Sunday evening at 7 under the direction of Mrs. Ron Mullins. The concert will be held at the church, 2118 W. Carson St., according to the Rev. Robert H. Coburn, pastor.

Included on the program will be Christmas spirituals "Go Tell It on the Mountain" and a solo, "Sweet Little Jesus Boy," sung by Michael Powers.

"Sing We Noel, Noel," a French noel, will be accompanied by tambourine and finger cymbals.

A medley of favorite carols will be "O Holy Night" and "Silent Night."

Excerpts from the cantata, "The Story of Christmas," will feature the soprano voice of Mrs. Nita Paschall.

Flutists Ruth Mitchell and Lynn Stanley will accompany the choir in Bach's "Sheep May Safely Graze."

From Handel's "Messiah," the air, "Come Unto Him," will be sung by Mrs. Bonnie Medved. The choir will sing the triumphant "Hallelujah Chorus."

At Wayfarers' Customs of Christmas On Exhibit

"Everywhere, Everywhere Christmas Tonight!" is the theme of the current exhibit in the library-museum at the Wayfarers' Chapel at Portuguese Bend. Customs from more than 30 countries around the world are represented through salon photographic prints, the work of photographer Jan Sampol.

Browsing through the library, one learns that the camel brings the gifts in one country, while wooden shoes serve the children of another land. Hay, piles of grain, the Advent Wreath, the Yule log, and the ever-lovely Lucia Bride are but a few of the customs among those known and those of less universal fame that are depicted by photograph and legend in this fascinating collection.

Again this year, too, the chapel is proud to have the lovely figures of the Nativity, created for a rock-bound creche by Mrs. John Wulffson of Palos Verdes Estates.

This special exhibit of Christmas in Many Lands may be viewed daily at the chapel between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. It will remain on display in the library-museum through Jan. 6.

An outdoor Singing Christmas Tree program will be presented by the Bethesda Assembly of God Church and Gardena Christian School on the parking lot of the church and school located at 1473 W. 182nd St., Gardena. The tree will be approximately 30 feet tall and hold 40 to 50 persons.

The program will be presented on Monday through Thursday evenings, Dec. 20-23 from 7:30 until 8:30. Both children and adults will blend their voices in the old time favorite Christmas carols during this hour.

The tree will be decorated with pine branches, colored lights, and tinsel by youth and choir of the church. The singers will stand on five levels forming the pyramid of the tree.

The purpose of the project is to promote the theme —

Evolution Of Universe Is Subject

"Is the Universe, Including Man, Evolved by Atomic Force?" This is the subject of the lesson-sermon to be presented in Christian Science churches this Sunday.

Pastor Robert Pruett will conduct the annual Candlelight Communion Service immediately following the cantata.


"The Angelic Message to the Man of the Moon-Shot Age" will be the topic for pastor Pruett's sermon at the 11 a.m. worship services.
