CURRIED SHRIMP SNACKS

- 3 4-oz. jars Lasco Shrimp Cocktail
- 3 tbs. mayonnaise
- 1 tsp. curry powder*
- 1 tbs. finely diced onion
- Crisp crackers

Combine mayonnaise with curry and onion. Spread generously on cocktail crackers. Place one undrained shrimp on each cracker. Garnish serving plate with parsley. Makes 24 appetizers.

*More curry powder may be added for a stronger flavor.

Custard Sauce Is Popular Topping

A delicately flavored, smooth custard sauce is tremendously popular for topping slices of uniced cake for bread puddings, canned pear halves, chocolate or other flavored ice creams. This is a handy recipe to have and to enjoy often.

Combine 2 tbs. sugar and dash of salt in top of double boiler. Blend in 1 lightly beaten egg. Stir in 1 cup light cream and cook over hot water, not boiling, until mixture coats a metal spoon. Remove from heat and stir in 1 tsp. pure vanilla extract. Cool slightly, then cover. Chill.

- ### PARTY SWEET POTATO SOUFFLE
- 3 cups mashed sweet potatoes
 - 1/4 cup beer
 - 1/4 cup heavy cream
 - 4 tbs. melted butter
 - 4 egg yolks
 - 1/2 tsp. salt
 - 1/2 tsp. nutmeg
 - 2 tsp. grated orange rind
 - 4 egg whites, stiffly beaten

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Beat potatoes, beer, cream, butter, yolks, salt, nutmeg, and rind until fluffy. Fold in egg whites. Turn into buttered baking dish. Bake 25 minutes or until browned and set. Serves 6.
