Youth Aliyah was founded in Germany in 1934 having as its purpose the rescue of young people from oppression, poverty, and disease. Mrs. Wohl has long been associated with Youth Aliyah, having visited North Africa, Iran, and Israel in connection with her work in its behalf.
