

Law in Action

The days after Christmas are "trading days." Those who got the wrong size, wrong color, or identical toys take them back to the store. As a rule the store will exchange the goods or credit you for the returned item as a matter of courtesy.

Stores want to keep your good will. The law does not require them to take goods back. The gift buyer or recipient cannot demand a refund or an exchange without cause.

THE CUSTOMER should not abuse his good will. He can't wait too long to exchange the goods nor demand a full refund for the item if, after Christmas, the store has marked down the price.

Unfair? No, the deal works both ways. If you had bought something that was marked down and several days later the price had gone up, the store could not demand that you pay the higher price.

Nor again is there a legal duty for the store to let you cancel the agreement. The store is bound to carry out its promise. It couldn't cancel your order unless you agree.

DEAL WITH reputable stores. Enforcement of your rights against stores which are not concerned with customer relations can be costly and time consuming.

If the goods have defects, you can claim an adjustment. The law will enforce the warranties stated to you or shown in written statements made about the product.

The law will also automatically attach some warranties, such as that the product is fit for its intended use.

IN RECENT years the courts have more often held that warranties on a product "follow" the product. Though the store and the buyer make the contract, the warranty often protects a third person, say someone who received the item as a gift.

On the other hand, the seller has rights that "follow" his product also. He can follow it with a "seller's lien" to enforce payment. Where an installment payment agreement is used, the seller often keeps title until the goods are fully paid for. If the buyer does not pay on time, the seller can usually repossess the item.
