Author Irving Stone To Teach USC Course

Novelist Irving Stone has been designated a Distinguished Lecturer in Writing by the University of Southern California's Department of English, and will conduct a special writing workshop for 20 selected students during the Spring semester.

In selecting students for the workshop, consideration will be given especially to those expressing interest in historical writing, and those who have already demonstrated writing ability. Priority for enrolling in the class will go to graduate students and upperclassmen.

In announcing that Stone had agreed to conduct the workshop, Dr. David H. Malone, chairman of USC's Department of English declared, "Having Mr. Stone on this campus will be a distinct honor and we look forward to the outstanding contribution he will make to our program in writing instruction. The writing skills of those fortunate enough to be included in the workshop group will benefit immensely by the opportunity to work in close association with such a distinguished author."

Stone's instruction will cover the writing of biographies and historical writing. Students will come from USC's departments of English, History, and Sociology after screening by Glenn A. Meeter, assistant professor of English.

The workshop will meet once a week in USC's new von KleinSmid Center for International and Public Affairs on Monday nights at 7:30.

USC librarian Dr. Lewis Stieg calls Stone "the outstanding author of biographical novels written in the English language," noting that all of Stone's works are in USC's 35,000-volume American Literature Collection. Well known for his "The

Agony and the Ecstasy." Stone is currently being praised for his biographical novel of the lives of Abigail and John Adams, "Those Who Love," which was No. 2 on the nation's best sellers list during November. Stone is also well recognized for his story of Van Gogh, "Lust for Life."

An alumnus of USC with a master's degree in economics, Stone was presented with an honorary Doctor of Laws degree by the University last June.

Seminar Held for NAA Group

Robert Costello of Torrance, director of the Palos Verdes-Torrance Chapter of the National Association of Accountants (NAA) has just returned from a special chapter seminar sponsored by the NAA.

Costello headed a delegation from the local chapter which included assistant directors Thomas J. Lawler, William B. Seaman, and William R. Glantz all of Torrance, and Carl R. Lomerca of Redondo Beach.

The seminar, a joint project of all Los Angeles County chapters of NAA, was conducted by Walt Kasunic, manager of chapter relations, and William Hallett, national director of the NAA.

Topics covered included attendance, membership growth, committee activities, programs, and other procedures and problems of local chapters.

The Palos Verdes-Torrance chapter is the newest Southern California chapter. It is attempting to reach all Southwest area financial people to begin a program of technical sessions.

Garden Checklist

1. You can lift your tuberous begonias now. Wash the tuber and sort in boxes where the air can circulate freely around them. Only one layer deep in the box, please. It's best to dust with a fungicide before starting.
2. Where the tuberous begonias were, consider cinerarias... or nemesia, or the English Primrose or Fairy Primrose. English Primroses will take more frost than Fairy Primroses.
3. Start new house plants now. Poinsettias, African violets, jade plants, grape ivy, pepper face, prayer plant, and dozens of other foliated and flowered plants that love life indoors are available at your nursery.
4. You can have amaryllis blooming indoors in February if you start the bulbs in pots now. Crocus bulbs may also be forced indoors for bloom in 7 or 8 weeks. Your nurseryman will show you how.
5. Start crabgrass control now by knocking the seeds with one of the available controls. Your nurseryman will recommend the best one for your job.
6. Clean up litter in the garden, particularly any leaves under plants in a shady area where insects could hide and breed.
