Harbor College Sets Deadlines

Jan. 21 has been established as the deadline for applications to be submitted for admission to Harbor College for the Spring term, William H. McMasters, assistant dean of admissions, said today.

"A wiser choice of classes and hours will be available to the student completing all requirements early," McMasters said.


