New Classes Added

YWCA's Winter Program

With the completion of the new building addition, the Torrance YWCA has announced an expanded program of winter classes to begin during the coming week.

Two new classes have been added to the schedule, a class in the techniques of Home Movie Making and a class entitled "Mr. and Mrs. Physical Fitness."

Mrs. Carol Wood, executive director at the YWCA, states that special emphasis has been placed on the physical fitness program to eliminate the "holiday bulge."

Besides scheduling new sessions in the regularly programmed classes of exercise, interpretative dance, ballet and tap, three new classes have been added.

For boys, 8 to 11 years of age, a tap and acrobatic class will begin Thursday, Jan. 13 at 3:30 p.m. This class will teach the basic techniques of tap dance and routines to aid in the development of coordination, rhythm and balance.

For pre-teens, boys and girls, age 10 to 12 years, there will be a class in popular dancing. This class is designed to teach the fundamentals of social dancing as well as the dances popular with teenagers; to prepare pre-teens to be at ease on the dance floor. This class will meet Friday evening starting Jan. 14 from 7 to 9 p.m., and will include one hour of instruction and one hour of supervised practice. The class will end with a special "party-dance" with a live band.

For adults, the "Mr. and Mrs. Physical Fitness Class" will meet Thursday evenings from 7:30 to 9 p.m. begin-

ning Jan. 13. Patrick Tobin, instructor, has plans for exercises, games, social hour and many special events. This class gives husbands and wives an opportunity to enjoy an evening of fun while attaining physical fitness.


Several other new classes have been scheduled with summer travel and vacation in mind. A class in Spanish for men and women has been slated every Wednesday evening from 7:30 to 9:30 for eight weeks, starting Jan. 12.

Mr. Hambley, instructor, will include basic conversational Spanish with special emphasis on aids to travelers such as key words for menu, directions and money in Spanish-speaking countries.

Visual aids such as slides, movies, and Spanish periodicals will be used. An additional eight week session will be scheduled upon sufficient request.

On Wednesday, Jan. 12, at 7:30 p.m. a class in making better home movies will start for an eight week session. R. Sandler, instructor, will discuss use, care and selection of all kinds of photographic equipment. A special session on slides and general photography will be included. Class participants will have an opportunity to show their home movies for general criticism and suggestions.

'Sacramento Socialism' For Republican Women

Robert S. Stevens, Assemblyman from the 60th District and candidate for election in 1966 to the State Senate, in District 25, will speak to Republican women on "Sacramento Socialism" Thursday, in Smith Brothers "Indian Village."

The event is the noon luncheon meeting of the South Bay Club of Federated Republican Women.

Stevens has been a member of the California Assembly since 1962. He serves as a member of the Assembly Committees on Rules, Judiciary, Finance and Insurance and Governmental Efficiency and Economy. He is also a member of the Joint Senate and Assembly Committees on Higher Education and Legislative Organization.

Last November, Stevens announced that he will be a candidate for election in 1966 to the State Senate in District 25, one of the new Los Angeles Senate Districts created by the recently passed reapportionment bill.


Graduation
