## New \$700,000 Facility Started By Paul's Chevrolet Officials

Groundbreaking ceremonies marked the beginning of a new \$700,000 Chevrolet sales and service center for Torrance this week, according to Ted Green, president of Paul's Chevrolet. Value of the new Chevrolet headquarters at 23505 Hawthorne Blvd. has been placed at \$700,000, and will be one of the largest showroom facilities in the area. Agency President Ted Green was joined by Martin Jacobs, vice president; Mayor Albert Isen, city councilmen, and other city and General Motors officials in marking the beginning of construction. The firm, located at 1640 Cabrillo Ave. in downtown Torrance since 1947, will be located on a five-acre near the intersection of Hawthorne Boulevard and Lomita Boulevard when the present building program is completed, Green said. The new facilities will offer 7,500 square feet of showroom space, complete body and service departments under one roof, each equipped with the most modern equipment to facilitate fast diagnosis and remedy for service problems. ## Advanced Classes Offered City's 'Gifted' Students

One hundred seventy-seven eighth grade students took courses in Torrance high schools this fall under the Torrance Unified School District's advanced placement program for academically talented youngsters. Heaviest enrollment was in algebra with 96 enrollees. Earth science attracted 28 students, and French, 18. Other courses and students enrolled were: Latin, 12; Spanish and German, eight for academically talented students. All but 17 of the students continued in the high school class of their choice after the first quarter, with a large majority achieving an "A" or "B" grade. Purpose of the program, according to Dr. Donald Dundan, curriculum consultant, is "to provide motivation, challenge, and recognition for academically talented students."

## Lyman Urges State Help In Solving Major Needs

Where great moral issues are involved, the church must help fight the battle in the political arena. Torrance Councilman David K. Lyman, a candidate in the 32nd Senatorial District, offered these words of counsel Sunday as he spoke before the congregation of St. John's Methodist Church in Watts. Criticizing a lack of concern and inaction on the part of many churchmen in helping to solve moral injustices, Lyman called for mutual cooperation between church and political leaders to dispell the outmoded theory "that you can't legislate morals." In addition to appealing for heightened interest in political issues, Lyman enumerated the four major programs he feels will benefit the Negro community in the Watts-Willowbrook area. (1) The state must provide help in finding and creating jobs, maintaining a constant inventory of jobs available, and helping people to find them. (2) People must be trained and re-trained for jobs where there is a demand. (3) The state legislature must help create a rapid transit system so people of the area can get to and from their jobs in a reasonable length of time. (4) The state must increase its standards and upgrade its enforcement in the fields of produce and meat quality control. Concluding, Lyman told the congregation: "I hope the tragic events of last summer have not had the effect of making people give up. If there ever was a time when all of us needed to put forth more effort, it is now." Lyman is a campaigning throughout the new 32nd Senatorial District, which encompasses an area from San Pedro to Watts.


