

## Mental Health Facility To Continue Operation

Assemblyman Vincent Thomas (D-San Pedro) today disclosed that discussions with the County of Los Angeles and the State Department of Mental Hygiene have resulted in assurances that community mental health services in San Pedro will be continued.

"I have received assurances from both the county and state departments that plans I suggested at a meeting in my office on Oct. 8, 1965, whereby the San Pedro Mental Health Clinic would be placed under the Short-Doyle

program are to be followed," Thomas said.

Under the Short-Doyle program, the local government pays for 25 per cent of the cost of operation of mental health clinics, while the state pays the remaining costs. Los Angeles County asked for state participation for the San Pedro facility a few weeks ago, Thomas explained.

"I have been informed the county has set aside the funds for this purpose," he said, "and the state has told me that approval has been recommended and will be forthcoming — hopefully before March 1."

Thomas said the county officials have indicated they will advance monies for the facility as soon as the state formally approved the program to permit continued care for present patients.

"I am pleased to have played a part in the retention of this invaluable facility and I am sure the mental health clinic will provide valuable service for the entire local area," Thomas said.

## Realtors Hear About Discipline

"Discipline and the Real Estate License" was the subject of an address by Stanley S. Feinstein at today's meeting of the Torrance-Lomita Board of Realtors.
