

# Dr. Hull Makes Appeal For School Bond Issue

A central vocational training school offers advantages over vocational courses in comprehensive high schools, Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools, said this week in last-minute pleas for passage of a \$12.5 million school bond issue Tuesday.

Voters will decide the fate of the bond proposal, which includes \$3 million for a central vocational training facility, in balloting Tuesday.

Dr. Hull made his claim

that the central facility providing better training in speeches before the Torrance Kiwanis Club, the Rotary Club, and the Ellinwood Homeowners Association.

**THE \$3 MILLION** earmarked for the vocational facility, he said, will be used to develop a \$1 million parcel of surplus navy land which is expected to be given to the school district shortly.

"Experience nationally shows that students won't attend competing high schools nearly as well as a center used by all high schools," the superintendent said.

A vocational school would have to be developed gradually, he stated. "There is no such thing as having sufficient funds to do it all at once. We will need the cooperation of neighboring districts in order to do it."

"IN THE STATE OF California," he said, "there is no

community to date that has been able to match its training needs with programs of adequate scope or quality. Everywhere in the state more persons are in need of occupational preparation than programs to serve them can accommodate."

"In addition to inadequacy in the number of existing programs," he continued, "thoughtful analysis also discloses weaknesses in existing programs, weaknesses that need immediate correction.

Changes must be made; innovations must be attempted; and practices and procedures must be made to conform to current and future demands."

If the voters authorize a vocational center for non-college bound Torrance students by approving the bonds, the superintendent stated, local action would be taken to preserve the strengths and overcome the weaknesses of existing programs.

OTHER PROJECTS which bond money would be used for, according to Dr. Hull, are more elementary school classrooms, improved facilities for departmentalized students, equalized facilities at the four high schools, purchase of an additional two elementary school sites, and construction of two new elementary schools.

Dr. Hull said passage of the bond would not increase the tax rate for bonds, but would merely extend the present rate. "By using bond
