Cancer Society Urges Stronger Warning Law

Leaders of the Continella Valley chapter of the American Cancer Society have expressed satisfaction with the effect of the U.S. Surgeon General's Report on Smoking and Health.

Comments were made at the American Cancer Society's second anniversary of the report.

"Although many of the findings of the report were based on American Cancer Society studies which had been made public as much as

nine years earlier, the government has far the greatest impact on the public," Mrs. Porter Marsh, district chairman for the Cancer Society's Continella Valley Unit, said.

MRS. MARSH said the American Cancer Society offered testimony in support of federal legislation which now requires all packages of cigarettes to carry a warning label.

"Although we feel that the law is not strong enough, we

are pleased that it was enacted," she said.

A drawback of the legislation is that it prohibits California or any other state from passing supplementary laws to intensify public education programs concerning the health hazards of cigarette smoking, Mrs. Marsh said.

"This provision was written into the legislation by friends of the tobacco states, but it will expire in four years," she explained.
