Fewer Pleasure Boat Accidents Reported

California's 436 pleasure persons died when a 35-ft. vessel and a 15-ft. motorboat capsized in the Catalina Channel. Four persons, two of them children, drowned when their boat swamped in Suisun Bay.

Explosion and fire aboard 40 boats resulted in two deaths, critical injury to 27 and an estimated loss of \$188,000.

Boat collisions killed three persons and injured 14.

Three persons were killed and 12 injured in water skiing accidents.

The Division of Small Craft Harbors conducts a continuing review of reported boating accidents to identify their causes and determine ways of preventing them. The division's accident prevention program includes boater education in safe practices, improved safety laws, the removal of physical hazards and the proper marking of boating waters.

HILL RISE SEEKS 2ND HANDICAP

A brilliant field of handicap stars is in prospect for the 29th running of the \$145,000-guaranteed Santa Anita Handicap at Santa Anita Park Saturday.

Hill Rise seeks to become the first horse in history to win the Big 'Cap' a second time.

The California-bred 5-year-old last year won the rich event with a stirring stretch drive. The 1 and 1/4-mile classic has a purse of \$100,000 guaranteed the winner.

Hill Rise is fresh from his victory over Terry's Secret, Bold Bidder and Native Diver in the San Antonio Handicap and will carry the same impost of 125 pounds with Jockey Manuel Yeaza up.

Native Diver will have top weight of 128, two less than his impost of 128 for the San Antonio in which he faded to fourth after setting most of the early pace.

An added factor in the race could be Lucky Debonair, winner of last year's Santa Anita Derby and later the Kentucky Derby.

Figure 8's Return to Ascot Park

A trio of Troy Still of Long Beach, Vernon Thomas of Norwalk, and Ed Sauer of Torrance will lead a 50-car field in this Sunday afternoon's ARA Figure 8 Stock Car races at Gardena's Ascot Park, 183rd St. at So. Vermont Ave. at 2 p.m.

Besides the regular 10-event Figure 8 racing card, a 10 car Destruction Derby is planned to add increased action on the days slam-bang racing show. Highlighted is a 20-lap Figure 8 racing main event on the twisting criss-cross course. Other racing includes a pair of 12-lap semi-mains, four 10-lap heat races, and a 6-lap trophy dash.


