Ready in November

Carson Street To Be Improved

Authorization for the improvement of Carson Street from Normandie Avenue to the Harbor Freeway and a section of Vermont Avenue near Carson Street has been announced today by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

Bids for the project will be opened March 29. Construction is slated for completion in November, 1966.

THE IMPROVEMENT is part of a program to upgrade roads in the Carson area, Hahn explained.

Work will consist of providing six-lane, fully curbed highways within 100-foot rights-of-way on Carson and Vermont. Included in the project will be the construction of curb, gutter, sidewalks, pavement, and roadway drainage systems.

IN ADDITION, traffic signals at the Carson Street intersections with Normandie and Vermont avenues will be upgraded. New traffic signals will be installed at the Harbor Freeway off-ramp.

Supervisor Hahn said the state is contributing \$9,000 toward the cost of installing the traffic signals at the Harbor Freeway off-ramp.

"THIS IS A first stage project in the programmed development of the 2.4-mile stretch of Carson Street between Normandie Avenue and the San Diego Freeway," Hahn said.

Both Carson Street and Vermont Avenue have an existing capacity of 35,000 vehicles per day, he said.

The completed improvements will provide for a daily average capacity of 35,000 vehicles on each highway.
