## Bus Lights Will Shine

Headlights on Torrance school buses will shine all day, every day next week, according to John Mock, supervisor of transportation of the Torrance Unified School District.

Purpose of the daytime glow will be to emphasize school bus safety week.

Endorsed by California Highway Patrol Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden, the week-long event was planned by school bus operators throughout the state to call the attention of the motoring public to the fact that school buses need the support of all drivers in order to transport youngsters safely.

"We're carrying the most precious cargo there is," Mock said. "And the biggest problem school bus drivers have is the public's disregard of the flashing red lights at the front and rear of every school bus when it is loading or unloading students who have to cross the street. We hope that school bus safety week will help motorists remember all year long that the law requires them to come to a stop for youngsters getting on and off school buses."
